## PREFACE

The Nurse Media Journal of Nursing (NMJN) is an international journal published by the Department of Nursing, Faculty of Medicine, Diponegoro University and strives to provide the most current and best research in the field of nursing and health sciences. The journal has been indexed in the Google Scholar, Portal Garuda/Indonesian Publication Index (IPI), Indonesian Scientific Journal Database (ISJD) and Directory of Open Access Journal (DOAJ).

In this year 2016, NMJN has made some changes in its performance to improve the quality of the journal. Firstly, it is such an honor that NMJN has invited and collaborated with editors and reviewers from Indonesia, Europe, and Australia to review the articles sent to this journal. Secondly, NMJN has made some necessary changes in the format of the article, and the author guidelines. These changes are expected to provide more interest for researchers throughout the world to disseminate their studies in this journal.

This issue (NMJN, Vol 6 (2), 2016) has published 5 articles, consisting of four research articles and one case study report. This issue was authored and co-authored by the researchers and professionals from diverse countries, including Indonesia, Japan, Philippines, and Australia. All papers have been double-blindly reviewed by the editors and reviewers of this journal.

The first article was a descriptive study conducted by Tuppal et al (2016). The study investigated the extent of collaboration in building academic-service partnerships based on the perceptions of the students, faculty, staff nurses, and nursing administrators. An enhancement program as an alternative to strengthen the status of nursing amidst radical reforms in the healthcare delivery was also interestingly proposed in this article.

The second article was a descriptive qualitative study related to the changes in male genitalia and sexuality in the castration-resistant prostate cancer patients and was carried out by Kashiwagi & Kakinohan (2016). Based on the study cases, it was reported that the patients undergoing hormone therapy treatment experienced pains not only for prognosis but also for the physical changes, relationship changes with others and sexuality changes through the treatment.

The next article described a study by Sujana et al. (2016) and aimed to seek an understanding of the factors influencing the decisions towards maternal health services. This study used interviews and focus group discussions (FGDs) to collect data from three health workers and 40 maternal women in a sub-district in Central Java, Indonesia.

Another article described the mindfulness intervention to improve self-efficacy and physical self-reliance of patients with pulmonary TB patients and was reported by Noorratri et al. (2016). Mindfulness is a process of learning to focus the attention on the present events with no criticisms against them, and the goal is to help someone develop awareness of the experiences occurring from time to time. Further effects of the mindfulness, especially on self-efficacy and self-reliance of the patients were described in the study.

The last article by Anggorowati et al (2016) highlighted the effects of the digital massager of oxytocin (DMO) on the milk production of breastfeeding working mothers. The results of this study showed that the DMO could increase the milk production on an average of 23 ml in the breastfeeding working mothers.

The NJMN would like to thank the respectful authors, reviewers, and editors for their contribution and collaboration in publishing this current issue. Furthermore, the editors would like to appreciate and call for academic papers from the nurse-practitioners, academicians, professionals, graduates and undergraduate students, fellows, and associates pursuing research throughout the world to contribute to this international journal.
