I would like you to consider the attached manuscript titled "*Parental Resilience Determinants in Children with Cancer in Indonesia: A Path Analysis*" for publication in the *Nurse Media Journal of Nursing* as an original article.

While many studies have investigated the effect of eHealth on the knowledge and ability of patients/families in the care of cancer patients, we have not come across any papers that deal with the management of a variety of symptoms during chemotherapy based mHealth applications to parents who have children with acute lymphoblastic leukemia. We conducted research development and testing of mHealth applications using a user-centered design approach and came up with applications that meet user needs and are easy to use. We feel that this research can facilitate the needs of patients and families in childcare while undergoing chemotherapy lymphoblastic leukemia and, in the future, further studies need to investigate any perceived challenges in the use of mHealth applications.

There have been many studies conducted to look at the psychosocial aspects of parents who have children with cancer such as psychological distress, uncertainty, anxiety, quality of life of parents. As it is known that children who experience chronic and terminal disease conditions are very dependent on their parents. Sick conditions and treatment/care can disrupt the family's system and adaptation so that it requires the resilience of parents to control the situation. The relationship of psychosocial aspects that contribute directly or indirectly to the resilience of parents who have children with cancer in Indonesia needs to be evaluated so that in the future interventions can be designed to strengthen the resilience of parents.

We believe that the findings of this study are relevant to the scope of your journal and will be of interest to its readership. I have provided tables summarizing the findings.
